



2010 Membership Committees & Work Groups

COMMITTEES

BILLING MANAGERS COMMITTEE

The Billing Managers Committee focuses on issues related to billing & collections and develops educational programming for this specialty group. Meets quarterly.

EDUCATION COMMITTEE

The Education Committee assists with the planning and development of education programs, including the Annual Conference, that meets the needs of our diverse membership. Meets quarterly.

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS COMMITTEE

The Emergency Preparedness Committee assists with planning education and developing tools to facilitate agency preparedness and disaster recovery. Meets quarterly.

ETHICS COMMITTEE

The Ethics Committee formulates strategies related to ethical issues of concern to home care and hospice including fraud and abuse. The committee develops educational programs & innovative methods related to ethics management. Meets quarterly.

FISCAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Fiscal Advisory Committee reviews state & national fiscal home care issues, develops recommendations for action, and promotes CFO/ CEO education on fiscal management. Meets quarterly.

GOVERNMENT AFFAIRS COMMITTEE

The Government Affairs Committee reviews state & national laws, regulations, and issues impacting home care and hospice. The committee develops priorities and makes recommendations for action and strategies to support lobbying efforts. Meets quarterly.

HOME HEALTH AIDE COMMITTEE

The Home Health Aide Committee considers issues related to home health aide services, education, recruitment, retention, regulation and legislation. Meets quarterly.

HOSPICE COMMITTEE

The Hospice Committee identifies and addresses hospice issues/opportunities and action items, develops and/or recommends hospice educational programming, and develops tools/materials that will benefit hospice members. Meets quarterly.

MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE

The Membership Committee focuses on current and prospective membership by assisting the Association to develop membership policies and member benefits, develop recruitment plans and identify strategies for association growth and response to member needs. Meets quarterly.

QUALITY & CLINICAL PRACTICE COMMITTEE

The Quality & Clinical Practice Committee addresses quality and practice-related issues and develops positions & strategies to maintain & improve quality in home care and hospice. There are four work groups that fall under this committee. Each work group studies specific categories of care or disciplines & develops recommendations for consideration by the Quality & Clinical Practice Committee. Meets quarterly.

WORK GROUPS

INFECTION CONTROL WORK GROUP*

The Infection Control Work Group identifies issues and trends in infection control in or industry, recommends projects, and develops education programs or tools that support best practices. Meets only as needed to address issues or work on special projects.

REHAB SERVICES WORK GROUP*

The Rehab Services Work Group addresses issues related to rehabilitative services in home care and hospices and to makes recommendations concerning practice. Meets only as needed to address issues or work on special projects.

SOCIAL WORK SERVICES WORK GROUP*

The Social Work Services Work Group considers issues related to social work services in our industry, makes recommendations to enhance practice and works on special projects. Meets only as needed to address issues or work on special projects.

WOUND CARE WORK GROUP*

The Wound Care Work Group identifies issues and trends in wound care in our industry, recommends projects, and develops education programs or tools that support best practices. Meets only as needed to address issues or work on special projects.
